

ORGANIZATIONAL CHART

Sacred Earth Foundation, 501(c)3

Mission: To hold Sacred Earth Foundation lands in trust, steward with reverence, and teach sustainable living to children of all ages.

Board of Directors: Meets quarterly, with ongoing committee work

Advisory Council: Provides resources and advice on ad-hoc basis

Staff: Implements the day-to-day business of SEF in accordance with board policies and strategic direction

Community: Residential earth stewards making their home at Ekone Ranch. Some are also SEF employees, some are not.

Branches of Sacred Earth Foundation

1. **Land Trust** (currently 1060 acres)
 - a. Land acquisition to hold in perpetuity (no conservation easements to date, fee-simple ownership only)
 - b. Use as an educational facility and wilderness classroom
 - c. Stewardship activities
 - d. Forest management—fuel reduction, conservation, and restoration
2. **Educational & Experiential Programs**
 - a. Programs offered by SEF
 - i. Ekone Summer Camps for children; founded in 1986
 - ii. School field trips
 - iii. Retreats & Workshops for groups and individuals
 - iv. Workparties
 - v. Fundraising events & other gatherings
 - b. Programs offered by outside parties using Ekone as their facility and classroom; i.e. retreats, workshops, family gatherings, school programs, etc.
3. **White Eagle Memorial Preserve Cemetery**
 - a. Offering an option for simple, natural burial in a wilderness setting
 - b. Providing logistics, ceremonial, and deathcare support
 - c. Offering public education around sustainable, wholistic, heartfelt deathcare options
